start in 1st stage. The momentum of embracing this new way of living, this change, is growing amongst the clients of LIFE Recovery. Thank you LIFE!"



AGM HIGHLIGHTS

- Held Monday, April 23, 2018 @ Trinity CRC, Abbotsford, where about 30 of us sang, cried (following a client testimony) & rejoiced together in what God has done for LIFE
- Special "Thanks" to retiring board members: Dave Jansen & Marian Nienhuis.
- 4 newly elected for a total of 9 Directors (2018–2019): Co-chairs: Marian Vanderwal & Kevan Siggs | Co-treasurers: Shelley Fast & Chuck Poelman | Secretary: Janice Savoy | Jan Schutte | Len Visser | Frank Dykstra | Mary Anna Ouwenhand.
- Clinical Overview: record number of clients entering & completing stage one: 52%! Women are staying longer in our 2nd & 3rd stages; over 15% are Aboriginal; 50-60% are from the lower mainland; 1 to 2% from out of province for 2017.
- Financial overview: wonderful blessings include increases donations, grants, LIFE Second Chance Thrift Store, GALA & Golf fundraisers are all up from past years! "Heart felt Thank You" to all who gave & supported so generously!
- No summer student grants! As we did not check the attestation clause, we will not receive this grant. As our volunteers need a summer break & help is sparse, the board & store committee agreed to fund 2 of the usual 4 student positions. As this attestation policy violates our fundamental right to one's own freedom of beliefs & thoughts, any correspondence of opposition by email/mail (free) to Honourable Patty Hajdu, Minister of Employment, is strongly encouraged.

"DO YOU BELIEVE IN ANGELS?"

My name is Susan & this is my 20-year recovery journey from my addictions.

I was cutting myself with a knife by age 10 & drinking by age 12. This was the start of hell for me.

As a child, I didn't grow up knowing God. At the age of 11, a friend introduced me to church but I chose alcohol & drugs because it felt like it helped instantly. I became "invisible" with no cares.

I ran away from home several times, starting at age 12. I had many unhealthy relationships that included four pregnancies & one surviving child. Finally, while in an unhealthy marriage, I abandoned it all: my marriage, my child, my family, my friends & became homeless over a two year period.

After a serious incident with my abusive boyfriend, LIFE Recovery

was suggested to me & despite many reservations, it got me off the cold streets. I got introduced to God at that time but I was still very confused. I left Life Recovery because I wasn't ready to change & I became homeless for about 6 months.

I returned to my abuser. I tried to commit suicide a couple of times but my abuser stopped me, saving my life. While hitchhiking, I came by a church which opened their doors to feed anyone who was hungry. This act of kindness triggered a memory: this is what the women at LIFE Recovery had meant about surrendering my will & my life over to the care of God. I surrendered that day.

Following a night in the pouring rain & a heated argument with my abuser, a lime green car drove by & then came back. A young man in his late 20's asked me if I was okay &, despite me giving him the warning to go, he

stayed & stood up to my abuser by stating that "he was a child of God & what you're doing to this lady was wrong." At that moment I knew God had heard my prayer the day before. I left with this stranger. We made 3 stops: a church for dry clothes, McDonald's for food & LIFE Recovery for help.

I do not know this young man's name nor have I seen him since but I know that he was my Angel from God that day. Since then, I have almost 8 years of sobriety, an amazing relationship with God, with my daughter, with my new husband, with my family & with my new friends. I am also serving as a responsible, contributing member of society with a job & paying taxes.

I am eternally grateful for the staff at LIFE Recovery because I wouldn't have the life I have today. They loved me. They told me the good & the bad about myself. They taught me how to change



& how to have a good relationship with God. They taught me how to live life on life's terms. Still, to this day, I know that if I am struggling, or even if something exciting is happening in my life, LIFE Recovery is still there for me.

Susan's favourite verse: 1 Cor. 13:4-7, "Love is patient & kind...Love never gives up, never loses faith, is always hopeful, & endures through every circumstance."

LIFE recovery has grown from 2 to 4 homes to meet the need, all possible because of the support of many. Please continue to pray for this ministry, for more of His Angels & the fruit of LIFE's program. Helping us in whatever way God has gifted you means so much to women like Susan. God Bless You in all you do for LIFE!
